Paul Gray is Professor Emeritus and Founding Chair of the School of Information Systems and Technology at Claremont Graduate University. He specializes in information systems, particularly decision support systems, knowledge management, data warehousing, and electronic commerce. Before coming to Claremont in 1983, he was a professor at Stanford University, the Georgia Institute of Technology, the University of Southern California, and Southern Methodist University. He was a professor for over 30 years and served as department chair for 15 of those years. Prior to his academic career, he worked for 16 years in research and development organizations including nine years at SRI International. Prof. Gray retired in May 2001, but continues to teach as a visiting professor at the University of California at Irvine, does research, consults, and curates the Paul Gray PC Museum at Claremont Graduate University.
